

No. L030 00 Creamed Ground Beef
Feeds 100

BEEF,GROUND,BULK,RAW,90% LEAN
18 lbs

ONIONS,FRESH,CHOPPED
1 lbs

FLOUR, WHEAT, GENERAL PURPOSE

1 qts + 2 cups

SALT 1-7/8 oz

PEPPER, BLACK, GROUND

1/4 oz

WATER, WARM 2 gal + 2-1/2 qts

WORCESTERSHIRE SAUCE

2 + 1/8 oz

MILK,NONFAT,DRY

2 qts + 1/2 cup

#### Method

Cook beef in steam jacketed kettle or roasting pan until beef loses its pink color, stirring to break apart. Drain or skim off excess fat. Add onions; stir-cook 3 minutes.

Combine flour, salt and pepper. Sprinkle evenly over beef and onions. Mix thoroughly; cook about 5 minutes until flour is absorbed.

Reconstitute milk. Blend Worcestershire sauce into milk. Add to meat mixture.

Heat to a simmer, stirring frequently. Cook 10 minutes or until thickened. CCP: Internal temperature must reach 155 F. or higher for 15 seconds. Hold for service at 140 F. or higher.

(Light) in many 25 September, 1962. We know the rest of the story. Savannah, GA. On 14August 1941 Capt Robert I. Fletcher took command, and the Sq. was redesignated the 89th Bombardment Sq. (L) with the twin engine A-20 light attack bomber.

On 19 January 1942 the Sq. personnel shipped out of Savannah heading for Australia via San Francisco, CA. The Sq. served in heavy combat from several stations in Australia until 17 August 1942. At several stations in New Guinea until 15 No- Luzon, Papua, East Indies, Northern Solomons, Western Pavember 1944. On Leyte, Philippines Islands 30 December 1944 until 25 July 1945. During the period January 1945 until 6 May 1945 the 89th was reduced to one officer and one enlisted man for record keeping after all other personnel were moved to strengthen other flying units. On 6 May 1945 the depleted Sq. was assigned to the 38th Bombardment Gp. and received new personnel from the inactivated 882nd Bombardment Sq.

The Squadron was inactivated 1 April 1949.
