Changes To Your TAC Missileers Newsletter Delivery Method Pending

Like many other fraternal organizations our costs are escalating, revenues are declining and membership is stagnant. We have confronted that reality and think we may have found a workable solution that will still benefit all members and allow the TAC Missileers to continue to produce a newsletter to be received by all members. By unanimous vote at the Dayton business meeting the members present decided to stop, where possible, the mailing of the paper newsletter and issue an electronic copy via email to members wherever possible.

This issue of the TAC Missileers Newsletter, 11-3, is still being mailed to every member in good standing. We plan to initiate the delivery of all future newsletters to as many members as possible via the internet. We will either email the newsletter as an attachment or post the newsletter on our website and send out a notification that the newsletter is available to read and down load there.

As an example of what the online newsletter will look like please visit out website and go to the newsletter section, click on any issue and you will see how easy it is to browse through, read in detail or download and print out a newsletter on your own equipment at home.

This new delivery method, by its very nature, can only be used for those members which we have a confirmed email address. Only those members that want to receive the newsletter in this way will get it this way. Please do not be concerned about losing a single issue of your newsletter in the future. If we can not confirm an email address for an individual or group of individual members, we will continue to mail the paper newsletter to those members, if they have been receiving them in the past. We will not intentionally drop anyone from the mailing list because of the lack of an email address or internet access.

We are not ground breakers by doing this, many organizations have done away with their hardcopy or paper newsletter and use the Internet and email exclusively as the means to spread the word about events, happenings and keeping members connected with each other and their organization. It works well.

At this moment there are approximately 75 members that we have identified as having no email or that the email address we do have is no longer correct or is inoperable. Furthermore, because our active membership is declining, our Director and Secretary are hard at work endeavoring to update the entire membership address and contact list. We have lost track of a large number of members, whether by moves on their part or other circumstances, we don't yet know. Joe and Russ are trying to reach those missing members and others via telephone call, mailings and numerous bulletins placed on our website.

Until we have hard data on those AWOL members we will continue the quest of reestablishing contact with them. In the mean time the plan to modernize the delivery of the newsletter will go on and we intend to get the newsletter to everyone in the most efficient way at the most effective cost.

To reiterate, we want to insure everyone that all members will continue to receive the newsletters whether by the regular mailing method or by the soon to be initiated delivery via your email or by visiting the TAC Missileers website.

TAC Missileers Reunion Dayton, Ohio, July 16, 2009 1630 Hrs: The business meeting was called to order by President Julian Esposito at 1630 hours with 100+ in attendance. Julian thanked Max and Lois Butler for all the work they put into making this a fantastic reunion. Larry Emerson, Secretary, read the minutes of the Tucson 2007 reunion which were accepted as read. Max Butler, Membership Director/Treasurer, announced a buffet would be served this evening by the hotel. He went on to say that dues need to be in when due. Postage and printing costs are up and the dues are needed to pay these costs. Someone asked about electronic newsletters but there has been no response in the past. Some members don't have internet but changing to electronic for the majority of our members would greatly reduce the newsletter costs. Please notify Bob Bolton if you would accept email newsletter. Joe Perkins, Executive Director, talked about updating our web page and has a person helping with it. Newsletter would be included on the web page and could be downloaded. Max Butler gave a finance report. A copy of the report is attached. Current balance before paying for banquet, happy hour and breakfast is \$34,191.14. Treasurer's report accepted as read. A member of the audience asked about setting up life memberships. Bob Bolton recommended keeping current rates to insure a cash flow. Lois Butler stated that members MUST have a ticket for the bus to the air show on Saturday. She reiterated that members MUST show their ticket to get on the bus. There is a registration book at the registration table for names, addresses, phones and email addresses. Joe Perkins stated that dress code for the banquet to be held at the Wright Patterson AFB Officer's Club is semi formal (coat and tie.) He also stated that if anyone wants to make donations toward the General Vetter memorabilia that we donated to the National Museum of the United States Air Force they could give to Max. Any money left over would go to the general fund. Julian Esposito called for new business. Election of officers. Two positions are open due to Julian, President and Larry Emerson, Secretary, retiring. Julian gave a short speech and thanked everybody for allowing him to serve for the past eight years. Larry gave a short description of the secretary job and thanked everybody for allowing him to be secretary for the past six years. There were three nominations from the floor for President. Bill Simpson, Bob Kutulis and George Mindling. George declined and nominations closed. Bill Simpson received 61 votes and Bob received 26 votes. Bill Simpson is new President. For the position of Secretary Kenneth Roth asked if the board would accept a volunteer for the position. His name was put into nomination. Bob Bolton nominated Russ Reston and gave a short resume of Russ's qualifications. Vote was overwhelming for **Russ Reston**, our new Secretary. The remaining board members were voted in by acclimation. Max personally thanked Russ for all the effort he has put in to updating the web page. Russ also designed and printed the name badges we received for this reunion and was instrumental in contacting numerous missileers pertaining to this reunion. George Mindling thanked all those that helped he and Bob Bolton in the production of their book "<u>The U.S. Air Force Tactical Missiles, 1949-1969, The Pioneers</u>" Joe talked about having some original paperwork, orders, tech data, etc. on display along with The Mace and Matador missiles in the National Museum. A member of the audience asked about notifying members of their dues on the web site. The answer was that the dues could be listed on the web site if the members voted on it. Motion and second and passed unanimously.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned at 1721 Hrs.

Text of Letter Follows

Hello Art,

I'm glad we got in touch! I've been in and out, unfortunately (and am in and out again today). At any rate, I'm told you have a large collection of original photos and that your organization is looking for a permanent home for them.

The National Museum of the USAF is the Air Force's official home for materials like the ones you described—we preserve original photos, slides, films, documents, and artifacts. We concentrate on cultural materials that help tell the story of life in the USAF, and assist with the restoration and preservation of aerospace vehicles and related equipment. Our facilities are state of the art, including a large climate controlled film vault and an archival preservation laboratory, and our staff are trained professionals. Donated materials become property of the Air Force, and are carefully cataloged, stored, and made available to researchers. I strongly believe this is the right place for the type of collection you and Joe described In addition; we don't have a large collection relating to TAC missile operations and people.

Richard T. Boverie, 77, of Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, a retired Air Force major general and corporate executive, died on June 21, 2009. Gen. Boverie was born in St. Louis, Missouri, in 1932. He graduated in 1950 from Christian Brothers College High School, where he was class president, hurdler and relay runner on the Missouri state championship track team, and candidate for governor of Missouri Boys State.

He graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1954, at which time he was commissioned in the U.S. Air Force. He was a launch officer with the Air Force's first operational surface tosurface missile, the Matador; was a project officer in some of the Air Force's earliest space systems development programs; and served over time in various other Air Force and Office of the Secretary of Defense capacities in the U.S. and abroad. He completed his Air Force service in 1982 in the rank of major general. At that point, he was a deputy assistant secretary of defense, International Security Policy. He served

Your organization's photos would help us fill that hole in the USAF's collection, and of course if other materials came to light related to the period of service, i.e., photos, uniforms in good confrom your members-more images, uniforms, patches, diaries, etc- dition, diaries, documents, unit keepsake histories, and equipment -we'd be very happy to consider them for preservation as well.

By original material, I mean original photographic prints/slides and documents that are not digital copies or photocopies. I should have been more clear. No stamps are required, and we frequently receive photos from private collections that show "life on base" or similar scenes, and have no stamps at allthey're personal scrapbook photos, and the donors can usually give us a rough estimation of time and place. Some of our best stuff is from GIs who were eager shutterbugs and took a lot of pictures. I'll go ahead and send out the labels. I'm excited to see what treasures we can preserve re TAC missileers---as I mentioned, that's a thin spot in the USAF's collection, so your group's donation will help greatly in preserving the story.

I thought I'd pass on some winnowing tips to help you as you go through the TAC Missileers collection. The following items generally do not fit our collection needs: newspaper clippings, reunion newsletters, reunion photos, and related items that do not directly VOLUME 11 ISSUE 3
