Faux pas from Mace Missile Gets A Face-Lift

Several members took the time to respond with their discoveries of the various mistakes in the Fall 2004 edition of the Tac Missileers article about the I-75 landmark Mace getting a face-lift. As a refresher, the article covered the refurbishment of the Mace B on display at exit 146 on I-75 near Robins AFB, Georgia. The article, as published, in the Macon Telegraph contained several mistakes that would be known only to those of us who worked with the Martin Matador and Mace Tactical missiles. Here are the correct responses in the order that they were received:

George Mindling wrote:

"I look for that Mace on I-75 every time I go past Warner Robins, I wouldn't think I was on the right road if it weren't there. I hope they don't take down the Mace, bullet holes or not. There are two faux pas in the article: One about the mobile trailer launch, and the other about Korea. Unless you consider Okinawa near Korea! The B-Bird was only deployed at Bitburg and Karenna. School was originally at Orlando AFB but moved to Lowry when the A-Bird shut down. (I was permanent party GSC at Lowry during the move)." **George** is the web mister of the award winning web site, The 38th Tactical Missile Wing 18 June 1958 — 25 September 1966. If you haven't visited George's wonderful tribute to the 38th please check it out at http://home.quixnet.net/~ilsem/38tmw.htm. You nailed it George! **Richard Mathews** wrote:

"Concerning the I-75 Mace that needs a face-lift. It is about time. Mace was never in Korea, Matador was in Korea. Mace was on Okinawa at four different sites (Eight birds per sites). I know because I was assign to the 873 Tac Missile Squadron, 498 Tac Missile Group at Site two from Activation until March of 63." Right On Richard!

Garland France wrote:

First of all, it would be almost impossible for someone not even born yet to distinguish the difference in the 3 birds. Yes, he winds up talking about all 3. When he mentions "in or near Korea" he is talking about the Matador. When he mentions "portable launcher" it obviously is the A Bird. Finally, he mentions "inertial guidance" which as we all know is the B Bird. He is not the first to make these mistakes, a few years ago the Air Force Museum at Wright Pat. AFB had the A and B Birds incorrectly labeled in their official guide. I guess only the few of us that worked on all three really know the differences.

Matador-1960 Korea-Crew Training , A Bird-1961-1964 Lowry-Launch Training, B Bird-1970 Okinawa-Chief Crew 5. Exactly right Garland!

Ernie Edberg and Marge Visor correctly pointed out something totally unintended by writing:

"Ernie and I were happy to receive the latest newsletter of the Tac Missileers. And, yes, we did catch the faux pas and I'm sure many other of your discerning readers will find it also. Unless my calendar is wrong, August 27 was on a Friday!"

Mea Culpa, when I wrote up that little piece I accidentally mixed the day and date of the actual refurbishment process with the day and date that the article was published. The refurbishment was conducted on Thursday, August 26th and the article was published in the Macon Telegraph on Friday, August 27th. Just another example of the proofreader (me) letting the editor (me) down. Good catch Ernie and Marge.

Now for my input, the article also mentioned the "earlier CGM-13A". Now if I'm not mistaken, the Mace A was first designated the TM-76A and late in its service life was assigned the designator **MGM-13A**. or **[Mobile Guided Missile]13A** where as the Mace B was the TM-76B and during the designator changes for Air Force and Army missiles became the **CGM-13B** or **[Coffin Guided Missile]13B**.

I am sorry that this issue of the Tac Missileers Newsletter is so lacking in content and short the normal center section. I have run up against the curse of a lot of active retired folks. I over committed myself and volunteered for a few too many projects around the area. I will try to make up for this poor showing in the next issue.


