I hope this doesn't make any of us feel too old. This month, June 20, 2007 to be exact, marked the 56th anniversary of the first launch of a Matador from Cape Canaveral. It was the first of the 18 so called "Bright Red" Matador

B-61s that the Glenn L. Martin Company launched between June 20, 1951 and May 23, The fledg-1952. Force ling Air Guided Missile Group assisted in 16 those of launches.



Air Force personnel completed the first successful "all-military" Matador launch on December 7, 1951, Technical delays hindered the program in 1952 and 1953, but the first two operational Matador A squadrons departed Patrick AFB for Germany in March and September 1954.

Call Signs Revisited

More than a year after I thought that we had put the Call Sign material to bed to the satisfaction of all. It turns out that the subject is not ready to lie down after all.

At Tucson, during an evening's conversation with **Hank Barlow** and several other Grovelers, the 38th Tac Missile Wing and the Mace sites' call signs subject came up and Hank threw a great big verbal monkey wrench into the record I thought was firm. Based on input from other missileers and my own "dim" recollection, the 38th Tactical Missile Wing's call sign was "Cap Gun". But, that was blown out of the water by Hank's comment. When I published the "Final Definitive" report I listed the 38th Tac Missile Wing's call sign as, "Cap Gun", without receiving a negative on that.

In our earlier "research" on the call signs and while asking for your advice and input on the subject I forgot and never listed the 17th AF. But, the moment that Hank questioned me on the it I had a case of the "Oh #%@&'s", he is correct, the17th was in on the communications loop! dors to verify enhancements in the Matador weapon system and complete training requirements.

The only public Matador demonstration launch ever staged was held at Patrick AFB

on May 20, 1956 during the base's Armed Forces Day celebration.

Matador research and development testing was concluded in 1956, but various Tactical Air Command units continued to launch Matadors at the

Cape well into 1961, The last Matador was launched from Cape Canaveral on 1 June 1961. The Matador, with 286 flights to its credit, stood out as the most-launched winged missile of its era.

No one at the table that evening other than Hank could or would say that they recall 17th being "Cap Gun". That in its self was strange because whenever there are more than two Groverlers together there is usually a good natured argument about most any subject. But that night no one else remembered for sure.

Hank maintains that he recalls that the 17th's call sign was "Cap Gun" and the 38th's was "Yellow Tail". Its been nearly 41 years and I honestly don't remember "Yellow Tail" at all and I stood many, many hours of communications duty in the block-houses at Grünstadt. I'm not saying that because I don't remember it makes Hank wrong.

Help us out here folks, I would like a confirming yes, that the 17th AF was "Cap Gun" from someone else that remembers and agrees with Hank. If I get that "yes it was" I'll re-print and correct our list and give Hank the credit for the correction.

So let's hear it guys...the question is, was the 17th "Cap Gun" and the 38th "Yellow Tail"?

First 'Select Missile Crew'

The first 'Select Missile Crew" in the history of the U. S. Air Force has been designated by USAFE's 38th Tactical Missile Wing. This is the Air Force's pioneer tactical missile organization. Announcement of this achievement was made by Colonel Fred W. Vetter Jr., Commander of the 585th Tactical Missile Group, in ceremonies at Bitburg Air Base, Germany on January 20, 1961.

By this selection, the Air Force has taken another significant step toward elevating missiles to a place of growing importance with manned aircraft. The action highlighted the in creasing role of the missile in the Air Force aerospace mission. Missile units can now boast of "select crews" just as SAC is proud of its select bomber crews. Crew B-5 of the 71st Tactical Missile Squadron won the unique and commendable "select" designation only after satisfying requirements of an extensive and detailed evaluation which lasted several months. An excellent example of their professionalism and outstanding proficiency was the skill and accuracy with which they fired a live Matador missile down range at Cape Canaveral, Florida. During the ceremonies, Colonel Vetter was high in his praise of Captain Ira D. Hale Jr., Crew B-5 Launch Officer and all the members of the crew. They are S/Sgt. Raymond L. Adams, S/Sgt. Ramon Cuen, S/Sgt. Harold D. Elliott, S/Sgt Byran J. Haddix, S/Sgt. John E. Lewis, S/Sgt. Paul E. Roach, A/2C James H. Grim, A/2C Michael J. Keller, A/2C Gary L. Littrell, A/2C Paul A. Mains, A/2C Raymond J. Metheny Jr., A/3C Frederick T. Crase.

"I'm extremely proud of these men," said Colonel Vetter. "They have an esprit de corps higher than any l've seen in my years in the Air Force. They are dedicated men, the stuff of which an aroundthe- clock combat ready unit is made."

Chinese Friendship Delegation Visits Soka Gakkai's Okinawa Training Center

On April 10, 2006 a delegation from the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries, led by President Chen Haosu, visited Soka Gakkai's Okinawa Training Center and were welcomed by local members. There, the Chinese delegates toured the **Okinawa** World Peace Monument, which was built upon the site of a dismantled U.S. **MACE B missile base**. The colossal concrete mass measuring 100 meters by 9 meters, and with a wall 1.5 meters thick, was used as a **launch pad** for nuclear missiles targeted at China. Mr. Chen expressed admiration for Mr. Ikeda's idea to leave the site untouched as a perpetual reminder of the horrors of war and for the fact that many youth come to the center to study about peace.

In what has now become a reunion tradition for some of the 887th Grovelers, on Thursday, May 3rd, SAM Moore, Ski Wiatrowski, Ed Johnson, Mike Brashear, George Glaush and Bob Bolton participated in the Third biennial Albert Griese Memorial Flight. 
